

## **NHS Immunisation Statistics, England: 2005-06**

## KEY FACTS

- Uptake of MMR vaccine by 2 years of age was estimated as 84% and has increased across every region in England, although there are issues with missing data in the London region. This is an increase over the reported uptake of 81% for the 2004-05 cohort. <sup>(1)</sup>
- Uptake of vaccines by 2 years of age against diphtheria, tetanus, polio, pertussis, haemophilus influenzae type b and meningitis C was around 94%, a slight increase to those reported for the 2004-05 cohort although this could partly be due to missing data for some London PCTs <sup>(1)</sup>
- A decrease in BCG vaccinations from 628,300 in 2004-05 to 155,600 in 2005-06 due to changes to the BCG vaccination programme.
- An increase in the number of people aged 65 and over immunised against influenza from 71% in 2004-05 to 75% in 2005-06

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## INTRODUCTION

The information in this bulletin, about immunisation statistics in England, comes from:

1) The Health Protection Agency (HPA) Centre for Infections (CfI) for information on:

- Childhood immunisation uptake at ages 1, 2 and 5 collected through the Cover of Vaccination Evaluated Rapidly (COVER) data collection collected for PCTs
- Persons aged 65 and over immunised against influenza for all PCTs

2) The Information Centre (IC) collects information about the BCG programme and reinforcing doses on the KC50 return from known providers of immunisation services.

Current recommendations by the World Health Organisation (WHO) are that at least 95% of children receive three primary doses of diphtheria, tetanus, polio and pertussis in the first year of life; that at least 95% receive a first dose of a mumps containing vaccine (e.g. MMR) at age 12-18 months; and that at least 95% receive a measles vaccine by 2 years of age.

The current UK immunisation schedule (Table A) is for children to be immunised against diphtheria, tetanus, polio, pertussis (also known as whooping cough), *Haemophilus influenzae* type b (Hib) and meningococcal group C (MenC); and measles, mumps and rubella. The Department of Health recommended for 2005-06 that primary immunisations are administered in 3 doses at ages 2, 3 and 4 months except MMR, which is administered in a single dose at around 13 months of age.

Booster doses for diphtheria, tetanus, polio and pertussis and the second MMR are given to children by school entry age and further reinforcing doses of low dose diphtheria, tetanus and polio are given by school leaving age (Table A).

Prior to September 2005, immunisation against tuberculosis (BCG) was recommended for all children aged 10-14 years and also for persons in certain high-risk groups and contacts of known cases. From September 2005, the BCG vaccination programme delivered through schools has been replaced with a programme of targeted

vaccination for those individuals who are at greatest risk. The new programme identifies and vaccinates babies and older people who are most likely to catch the disease, especially in those living in areas with a high rate of TB or whose parents or grandparents were born in a TB high prevalence country.

## DATA QUALITY

### • COVER data

There have been some difficulties in London in moving from old child health systems to a new system supplied by the local service provider for the London Cluster.

This I.T. problem, in collecting childhood immunisation data in London, means that we have an incomplete picture in the capital. Previous years' data show that uptake rates in London are lower than in other parts of the country.

A total of 9 out of 31 PCTs in London have been unable to report data. As it is not possible to determine the impact of this problem on the uptake rate of the immunisation programme, data have not been estimated for these 9 PCTs. Consequently they have been excluded from the 2005-06 figures and any discussion on vaccination uptake levels in London needs to be treated with caution.

Their exclusion from the national totals is likely to have a marginal effect but it could account for some of the increase in the national rates.

Consequently, national comparisons with previous years should take into account that 9 London PCTs are missing and that their coverage rates tend to be lower than in other regions.

## KC50 data


Where a provider has been unable to submit data for the KC50 return, data for the latest available year are used with the permission of the provider. Some providers have only supplied partial data, therefore last year's data was used to impute the missing parts. If a PCT has supplied partial or no data it has been noted in the tables.

A copy of the KC50 and guidance notes is at the end of this bulletin together with the COVER data request form.

# ANALYSIS AND COMMENTARY

## Overview

Immunisation uptake for diphtheria, tetanus, polio, pertussis, Hib and MenC for children reaching their second birthday in 2005-06 were all around 93% and 94%, and slightly higher than the uptake reported for the previous cohort. These are mature programmes and changes from previous years are small unless otherwise stated. MMR vaccine uptake rose to 84% from 81%.



## Immunisation by first and second birthday (Tables 1, 2, 4, 7 and 8)

## Diphtheria, Tetanus and Polio

Immunisation rates against diphtheria, tetanus and polio are virtually identical as these are given as a combined injection.

In 2005-06, 91% of children had completed primary immunisation courses against diphtheria by their first birthday. The previous cohort, 90% of whom had been immunised by age 1 in 2004-05, reached their 2nd birthday in 2005-06, by which time a further 4% were immunised, bringing the 2-year uptake to 94% for diphtheria, tetanus and polio.

At a local level, only 25 PCTs reported diphtheria coverage by 2<sup>nd</sup> birthday of less than 90% in 2005-06; and 170 reported uptake of 95% or over. The same data for last year showed only 136 PCTs reporting an uptake of 95% or over.

- **Pertussis (whooping cough)**

In 2005-06, 91% of children reaching the age of 1 had been immunised against pertussis by their first birthday. For the previous cohort, 90% of whom had been immunised by age 1 in 2004-05, a further 4% were immunised by their 2<sup>nd</sup> birthday, bringing the 2-year uptake for pertussis to 94%.

- ***Haemophilus influenzae b* (Hib)**

In 2005-06, 91% of children reaching the age of 1 had been immunised against Hib by their first birthday. For the previous cohort, 90% of whom had been immunised by age 1 in 2004-05, a further 4% were immunised by their 2<sup>nd</sup> birthday, bringing the 2-year coverage for Hib to 94%.

- **Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR)**

In 2005-06, 84% of children in England reaching the age of 2 had been immunised against measles, mumps and rubella with the combined MMR vaccine by their second birthday. At a local level 256 PCTs reported uptake less than 90%, including 121 with uptake below 85%. 37 reported an uptake of over 90% compared to only 12 reported in last year's bulletin.

Data on the use of single vaccines is not collected. As a result the proportion of children fully or partially protected against measles and rubella may be slightly higher than that identified by COVER.

- **Meningitis C (MenC)**

In 2005-06, 91% of children had completed primary immunisation courses against MenC by their first birthday; 93% of children had been immunised by their second birthday. These figures are similar to those for 2004-05.

### **Immunisation at age 5 (Tables 3 and 9)**

The reported uptake suggests that for diphtheria, tetanus and polio, 80% of children have received their primary course and their booster by age 5 and 74% of children have received their first and second dose of MMR vaccine by age 5.

### **Reinforcing doses given to school leavers (Table 10)**

About 438,000 children (aged 13-16) were reported as receiving reinforcing doses of diphtheria, tetanus and polio in 2005-06. This figure is likely to be an underestimate as this vaccine is given through two independent routes, primarily through the school health service, for which data are thought to be incomplete, and by a small number of GPs.


### **BCG (Tables 5 and 6)**

About 44,000 persons were skin-tested in 2005-06, of whom 4,300 (10%) were found positive. This figure includes some who were positive due to previous immunisation. About 155,000 BCG vaccinations were administered, including over 106,000 to infants aged under 1.

There has been a significant decline in the number of skin tests and BCG vaccinations this year. This is due to the introduction of the new BCG vaccination programme from September 2005 which replaced the programme delivered through schools with a more targeted vaccination programme. This has resulted in fewer vaccinations being administered compared to previous years.

### **Provider level KC50 data (Table 10)**

Information by provider about BCG vaccinations and school leavers' reinforcing doses is shown in Table 10a (available only in the internet version). Although all trusts are listed in the table, immunisation services are provided by only about half of them.



## Influenza vaccine (Table 11)

The targeted risk groups for vaccination against influenza are persons aged 65 and over, and persons in clinical high risk groups, which include those with chronic heart disease, lung disease (including asthma), renal disease or diabetes, and those with immuno-suppression.

A new campaign to immunise persons aged 65 and over against influenza was introduced in 2000-01. Data collection undertaken by the HPA found uptake for this age group in England to be 75% in 2005-06 compared with 71% in 2004-05 (Figure 2)

## UK data

The COVER system also receives data from equivalent bodies in Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland. Tables of COVER statistics on uptake in the whole of the UK are published quarterly by Cfl in the *CDR Weekly* (website: [www.hpa.org.uk/cdr/](http://www.hpa.org.uk/cdr/)). Table B is an annual version for 2005-06 of these tables and shows that England has considerably lower coverage for all antigens than the other UK countries. This is primarily because coverage is far lower in London than in any other region.

## DEFINITIONS

The definitions used prior to 2001-02 related to children resident in health authorities. With the abolition of health authorities, information is now collected from PCTs and relates to children for whom the PCT is responsible (See COVER request form for definitions). Where information on this basis was not available, coverage figures on a resident basis have been provided as noted in Table 7 and 8.

Where a primary course consists of more than one dose of vaccine, administered at set intervals, immunised means having had the full course of vaccinations.

## FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

From September 2006 the pneumococcal vaccine will be introduced to the routine childhood immunisation programme.

## **ANNEX B- KC50 Guidance**

### **Completing the Immunisation Programmes – Activity Return (KC50)**

**1<sup>st</sup> April 2005 – 31<sup>st</sup> March 2006**

#### **Part A**

1. Please note that this relates only to school leavers and other children aged 13-16.
2. In columns 1-3, record the number of booster doses of Tetanus/ low dose Diphtheria (Td) and Polio given to school leavers during the financial year.
3. In column 4 record the number of 13-16 year olds receiving MMR vaccination in the financial year.
4. If any of the data submitted in columns 1, 2, 3 or 4 has significantly changed from the previous year, please enter your reasons in the text box directly underneath the grid.

#### **Part B - BCG (Tuberculosis) Persons aged 1 or over**

5. Part B relates to persons aged 1 or over who are skin tested or receive BCG vaccinations. Please note that the recording of BCG vaccinations for neonates and other children aged under 1 is now in part C of the KC50 return.

6. The current guidance on what is to be called positive and negative is as follows:

Found positive includes

Mantoux test - if raised area of induration is at least 5mm in diameter

Heaf test grade 2 (with complete ring of induration) or higher grade

Found negative includes

Heaf test grade 0 or 1 (but note that BCG is given only if previously unvaccinated)

7. In general, the number of skin tests found negative is considerably larger than the number found positive - if this is not the case in your area please add an explanation in the text box provided below the Part B grid.

8. If the number of positive skin tests for age groups 10-13 and 14-15 are not known please provide an explanation in the second text box after the Part B grid.

9. If the number of negative skin tests in programmes for schoolchildren should be roughly the same as the number of vaccinations given - again if this is not the case please add an explanation in the third text box provided underneath the Part B grid.

#### **Part C - BCG (Tuberculosis) Children aged under 1**

11. Part C relates to children aged under 1 who receive BCG vaccinations. Please enter data in line 1 or 2 according to the type of neonatal BCG programme currently active in your area. If different localities have different programmes, please enter data in lines 1 and 2. Line 3 should be used for any BCG vaccinations given to under-1s outwith routine or high-risk programmes.

12. Column 1 should be used as follows: where all neonates are routinely vaccinated, enter the number of births the trust is responsible for; where vaccination is limited to high-risk groups, and enter the estimated number of births that fell into the high-risk groups covered.
