Title	Addition of LSOA of Residence
Description	<p>Because of the forthcoming NHS reconfiguration there is a need to add Lower Level Super Output (LSOA) area of residence to the extract file which flows to the NHS Information Centre for health and social care. This will have no impact on data inputters and very little on system suppliers or the repository end at the NHS Information Centre for health and social care. This data is needed to support consistent geographical mapping over time to enable current and future services to be targeted at key areas for the purpose of surveillance, improvement and prevention.</p> <p>This change is effective from the 1st quarter of the 2011/12 submission for April 2011 to June 2011.</p>

Title	Sexual and Reproductive Health Activity Data Set
Description	<p>The Sexual and Reproductive Health Activity Dataset (SRHAD) mandates the collection of contraceptive activity data from sexual and reproductive health (SRH) services in a standardised data return. Additional SRH activities are also recorded within SRHAD with the exception of sexually transmitted infections data which is recorded via a different national dataset. SRHAD replaces the aggregate KT31 Central Return, although submission of KT31 will be permitted until the end of the 2011/12 collection period to allow services to implement SRHAD.</p> <p>The Sexual and Reproductive Health Activity Dataset (SRHAD) requires electronic recording and extraction of anonymised patient-level data. Clinics without an IT system to record and extract SRHAD data items will continue to submit a KT31 until they are able to do so. It is anticipated that all sexual and reproductive health services will be able to submit SRHAD returns by 2012/13, at which point the KT31 will be retired.</p>
